"Perceptual Mishmash" mixes up classical vocal, for a cause

- After a two-year hiatus, the **unSUNg** concert series returns with virtual format and charitable mission.
- The comeback concert features several unSUNg regulars and one new group.
- No tickets required instead, concertgoers and fans are asked to donate to a charity benefiting the Navajo Nation.

LOS ANGELES, CA – With a release on YouTube on August 30th, 2020 at 4pm, **unSUNg Concerts** return after a two-year hiatus, bringing a pre-recorded anthology program to the virtual platform. Rather than requiring tickets, the series asks that attendees consider donating to the <u>Water Warriors</u> <u>United</u> campaign of **Collective Medicine**, which aims to fill the gaps in service to the poverty-stricken and Navajo Nation. The already distressed community has been hit particularly hard during the COVID-19 pandemic, and this effort is part of unSUNg's new and ongoing effort to support various charities through their virtual performances.

With ARIEL PISTURINO at the helm as Artistic Director, unSUNg follows up their previous five seasons of the well-regarded anthology concerts that feature new and neglected works on the small end of the concert scale. The series will continue with its highly varied mix of styles and traditions within the classical vocal realm, but is taking those performances online, due to the widespread shutdown that will affect the performing arts for many months to come.

The program includes works presented by LA Camerata, as well as sets hosted by composers Amy Engelhardt, Juhi Bansal, George N. Gianopoulos, Jenni Brandon and David Avshalomov. All participants and organizers of this concert are donating their time on this project. A full description and listing of the program follows in the pages below.

Collective Medicine is a Native American network whose purpose is to gather resources that benefit and comfort fellow Natives. The **Water Warriors United** campaign offers comfort by providing water to the most vulnerable on the Navajo Nation during this pandemic. "We owe it to our elders and less-abled to know that they haven't been forgotten about. They are a respected and essential part of our community. Since May 12 we have delivered over 500 barrels and 126,000 gallons of water to 20+ communities on the Reservation!"

Founded in 2013, this grassroots concerts series presented new and neglected vocal chamber music while providing performance and live recording opportunities for professional classical singers, instrumentalists and composers. unSUNg collects "Songs Uncommon and New": passion projects from local pros, creating unique, collaborative concert experiences.

Each concert includes several "sets" of 5-20 min each, featuring passion projects from different presenters, with no two concerts the same. These diverse programs have included art songs, voice with various instruments, choral music, opera excerpts, and highly unusual repertoire performed by an array of professional performers, mostly based on Southern California.

Description:

unSUNg returns after a two-year hiatus, with a signature "mixed bag" concert of vocal chamber music, featuring several of the composers who have worked with us in the past.

The newest member of the unSUNg family, <u>LA Camerata</u>, offers excerpts from a Baroque opera written by a woman of color, exploring the challenges of love between a shepherd and a sea nymph. We'll hear comedic songwriting from an LA favorite, <u>Amy Engelhardt</u>; and an aria from <u>Juhi Bansal</u>, one of SoCal's up-and-coming opera composers. <u>George N Gianopoulos</u> brings a setting of Edgar Allen Poe's "The Bells"; a song cycle by <u>Jenni Brandon</u> in which a Native American woman sings to her child and mulls over her life; and a choral setting by <u>David Avshalomov</u> about togetherness, on texts by a Holocaust survivor who knew very well how important that is.

The concert title, "Perceptual Mishmash", reflects the gut-level recognition of our Artistic Director, **Ariel Pisturino**, as she compiled the works for this event. While this unusual collection of works may seem widely varied and disparate, there are common themes of love, life cycle and connectedness that wend their way through each set. We're sure you'll find common threads of your own as you listen.

The program will be presented on YouTube as a pre-recorded anthology concert, benefiting a charity that is hauling water to the severely underserved communities of the Navajo Nation. It is part of unSUNg's mission to use art to give back to the world with every concert, and we and our presenters

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are proud to be part of this cause and this musical mission, which combined, touches so many lives in so many ways.
